3 ORDINANCE NO. 18633
4

5 AN ORDINANCE introduced by City Manager Norton N. Bonaparte, Jr., amending the
6 project budget and authorizing as amended Improvement Project No.
7 29096-02 which provides for improvements to the Ash Street pump
8 station, and specifically repealing those sections of City of Topeka
9 Ordinance No. 18109 in conflict with this Ordinance.

11 WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Topeka did pass and approve Ordinance No.
12 18109 which authorized Improvement Project No. 29096-02 with a project budget of two
13 million four hundred thousand dollars (\$2,400,000.00) and authorized the issuance of two
14 million four hundred thousand dollars (\$2,400,000.00) of combined water, water pollution
15 control, and stormwater utility revenue bonds (“utility revenue bonds”); and

16 WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend the project budget to increase the size of the
17 project to include the construction of a new pump station.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
19 TOPEKA, KANSAS:

20 Section 1. That it is hereby deemed advisable and necessary and is also hereby
21 authorized that the following public improvement be made:

22 A. GENERAL NATURE OF IMPROVEMENT:

23 The project will include the rehabilitation of the existing pump station and the
24 design and construction of building a new pump station with a capacity of 24
25 million gallons per day. The project will also add an emergency generator to
26 the new pump station.

28 B. TOTAL PROJECT BUDGET COST:

43 Section 2. That the sections of City of Topeka Ordinance No. 18109 which are in
 44 conflict with this Ordinance are hereby specifically repealed and the rest and remainder of
 45 Ordinance 18109 which authorized issuance of two million four hundred thousand dollars
 46 (\$2,400,000.00) of utility revenue bonds shall remain in force and effect.
