

1 RESOLUTION NO. 7329

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3 A RESOLUTION introduced by Mayor Harry Felker amending the adopted 2003-2004
4 Capital Budget for the City of Topeka, Kansas, and rescinding City of
5 Topeka Resolution No. 7325.
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7 WHEREAS, a 2003-2004 Capital Budget has been adopted by the Topeka City
8 Council; and

9 WHEREAS, the Mayor has considered the adopted 2003-2004 Capital budget and
10 recommends an amendment to the adopted budget.

11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Topeka
12 hereby adopts the amended 2003-2004 Capital Budget consisting of the following
13 improvement projects and funding source as contained on Attachment "A," attached
14 hereto.

15 The City Council shall not authorize any other capital improvement projects for the
16 2003-2004 period without amendment of this Resolution after review and report by the
17 Capital Improvement Planning Committee. All proposed amendments shall be
18 accompanied by a fiscal analysis demonstrating the financial implications and the ability of
19 the City to fund such projects.

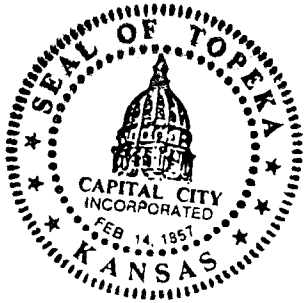
20 Implementation of the projects contained in the 2003-2004 Capital Budget shall be
21 approved by applicable ordinance or resolution as required by law. This Resolution shall
22 be amended when the project budget exceeds the amount identified.

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, this Resolution shall become effective upon passage
24 and approval by the City Council.

25 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that City of Topeka Resolution No. 7325 is hereby
26 rescinded.

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The mill levy figures represent the amount the mill levy would reach each year to pay for the projects in the CIP. Thus, from the current levy of 11.65 mills, the levy would rise to 12.94 mills in 2004, or an increase of 1.29 mills. These figures also take into account the transportation projects listed in the Other Revenue Source section, Page #3. Projects from Page 3 are figured at 10% Improvement District, and 90% GO Bonds. Actual Improvement District contribution could be more or less.
