Councilmember Price asked how they could prevent developers from encroaching on setback lines in the future.

Councilmember Stubbs asked if there is a penalty that can be charged to the developer.

Councilmember Chancler suggested implementing a policy that would penalize developers.

Bill Fiander stated that at this time City inspectors do not check property lines, however, the Public Works Department could include it as part of the inspection process.

Councilmember Preisner moved to close the public hearing and adopt the ordinance. The motion seconded by Councilmember Price carried. Councilmember Stubbs voted "no". (8-1-0)

The ordinance was adopted on roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Lane, Alcala, Pomeroy, Nave, Haynes, Duffy, Preisner and Price -8. Noes: Stubbs-1.

Councilmember Stubbs asked if the Public Works Department and Planning Department could create a policy.

CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. 93 introduced by Councilmember Jeff Preisner, amending City of Topeka Charter Ordinance A2-16 concerning the filing fee and petition requirements for filling a vacancy in the offices of Mayor or District Councilmember, and repealing the original of said Charter Ordinance placed on first reading March 16, 2004 was again presented.

Councilmember Preisner explained the charter ordinance and how it would refine the application process.

Richard Skinner spoke in opposition of the charter ordinance and stated that the increase in filing fees would eliminate qualified applicants.

Councilmember Stubbs stated that they need a policy to follow and the increase in filing fees and signatures helps ensure serious candidates and community support. She also gave a brief overview of the cost of a County Commission election and suggested that they double the filing fees for a regular election for Councilmembers or the Mayor.

Councilmember Stubbs moved to make an amendment to the charter ordinance to double the filing fee and signatures for regular elections. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Duffy.

Councilmember Alcala stated that he opposes the amendment and charter ordinance because he believes the process needs to be easier.

Councilmember Chancler stated that she would also oppose the amendment because she believes it is not necessary to pay a lot of money to be a qualified candidate. She stated that they need uniformity, not an increase in fees.

The amendment to double the filing fees and signatures carried. Councilmembers Alcala, Chancler, Nave and Haynes voted "no". (5-4-0)

Mayor McClinton noted that a supermajority vote is required to adopt the ordinance.

The charter ordinance was not adopted on roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Pomeroy, Duffy, Stubbs, Preisner and Price -5. Noes: Alcala, Chancler, Nave and Haynes -4.

Councilmember Duffy asked if it was possible to reconsider the original document.

Brenden Long, City Attorney stated that a member from the prevailing side of the original document that was voted on must move to reconsider.

Councilmember Nave moved to reconsider the amended charter ordinance. The motion seconded by Councilmember Chancler carried. Councilmembers Alcala and Haynes voted "no". (7-2-0)

Councilmember Stubbs moved to reconsider the amendment. The motion seconded by Councilmember Price carried. Councilmembers Alcala and Haynes voted "no". (7-2-0)

Councilmember Duffy moved to make an amendment to the charter ordinance to double the filing fee and signatures. The motion seconded by Councilmember Stubbs failed. Councilmembers Chancler, Pomeroy, Nave, Haynes, Duffy, Stubbs, Preisner and Price voted "no". (1-8-0)

The charter ordinance was adopted on roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Chancler, Pomeroy, Nave, Duffy, Stubbs, Preisner and Price -7. Noes: Alcala and Haynes -2.

AN ORDINANCE introduced by Councilmember Clark Duffy concerning the eligibility standards for the granting of economic development tax exemptions, amending Topeka City Code Sections 138-83 and 138-84, and repealing said original sections placed on first reading March 9, 2004 was again presented.

Councilmember Duffy stated that the committee report for items 5B, 5C and 5D all recommended "Do Not Pass".

Councilmember Duffy stated that he presented this ordinance because he did not believe city taxpayers should pay a company to bring unskilled labor workers to the Topeka area without health insurance. His intention was not to raise the minimum wage to \$9.00 an hour encouraging a cheap labor force standard in the City of Topeka.

Councilmember Duffy moved to adopt the committee report. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Haynes.

Several Councilmembers stated that they agree with Councilmember Duffy and do not want to encourage cheap labor force in the City of Topeka.

The motion to adopt the committee report carried unanimously. (9-0-0)

AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT between the City of Topeka and Shawnee County relating to financing countywide infrastructure and economic development to be funded by a one quarter of one cent countywide retailers sales tax was presented.

Councilmember Duffy moved to adopt the committee report. The motion seconded by Councilmember Stubbs carried unanimously. (9-0-0)

A RESOLUTION introduced by Councilmember Clark Duffy, relating to the issuance of industrial revenue bonds, providing procedures for review of Industrial Revenue Bond applications and rescinding City of Topeka Resolution No. 6876, was presented.

Councilmember Duffy moved to adopt the committee report. The motion seconded by Councilmember Nave carried unanimously. (9-0-0)

A COMMUNICATION to approve the selection of two Councilmembers to serve on the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Policy Board, was presented.

Councilmember Pomeroy stated that the term of office has not yet been set for the MPO Policy Board and he would like to defer the item until a decision has been made.

Councilmember Preisner moved to defer until April 6, 2004. The motion seconded by Councilmember Duffy carried unanimously. (9-0-0)

AN ORDINANCE introduced by Mayor James A. McClinton, authorizing Park Improvement Project No. 30246-00, which provides for the parking lot paving at various community centers as more specifically described herein, all pursuant to Section A12-1 of the Code of the City of Topeka was presented for first reading.

AN ORDINANCE introduced by Mayor James A. McClinton, authorizing Improvement Project No. 30250-00, which provides for the addition to the Carousel in Gage Park for ADA accessible restrooms and a multipurpose room for community use as more specifically described herein, all pursuant to Section A12-1 of the Code of the City of Topeka was presented for first reading.

Councilmember Stubbs announced that there would be a Public, Health and Safety

Committee meeting held on March 29, 2003 at 3:00 p.m. in the City Council Office.

REPORT FROM THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER, was presented.

Dave Graversen gave distributed the weekly Legislative report.

PRESENTATIONS BY MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL, were presented.

Councilmember Duffy thanked Ed Klumpp, Chief of Police for providing a City of

Topeka Crime Statistics Update memorandum to the Council. He asked if there would be a May

18, 2004 Council meeting due to the events scheduled for the grand opening of the Monroe

Historical Site.

Councilmember Pomeroy stated that there would be two meetings scheduled in the month

of May concerning the possible change or restructuring of City government.

Councilmember Chancler asked if it would be possible to schedule the committee

meetings later in the day to better accommodate those who have to work. She also announced

that the month of April has been designated as community clean up in the Monroe Area and
